

Creating a Basic Search from the Home Page

1. On the Home Page, enter your search terms in the **Find** field and click **Go**.



2. A search is run against all student databases on *Kids Search* and a Result List is displayed.



3. To view a specific source type (for example, only Magazines), click the source type icon.

Search by Topic

1. If you'd like to search for articles on a certain topic, you can click on a **topic** (for example, Sports) in the **Search by Topic** area. A list of subtopics appears on the right side of the screen.
2. You can check any subtopics in the **Search within current topic** area, and enter search terms in the **Find** field.
3. Click the **Go** button.

Top Searches

The most frequent searches are automatically displayed in the **Top Searches** area on *Kids Search*. To find articles about a top search, simply click the **link** and a list of articles appears.
